West Bethesda Church History

The church was organized by 20 members in the log cabin of James Martin on 31 January 1848 with Rev. John M. Crabb's assistance. James Martin had purchased the northeast ¼ of section 26 in Superior Township in 1846 and immediately dedicated a small section in the northeast corner to God as a place of worship. The group of settlers, from near Millport in Columbiana County Ohio, had organized the Bethesda Presbyterian Church there so when they migrated to Williams County the name of their new church became West Bethesda Presbyterian Church in honor and memory of the older church.

The first church, built in 1850, was a gram building 30 X 50 feet erected at the north edge of the present cemetery. The present building was erected in 1872-3 on the west side of the cemetery.

Up until the 1890's there was a platform on each side of the church for the convenience of loading and unloading passengers from their wagons. Four steps led down to ground level from the platform.

In 1944 the church floor was raised and a basement excavated. In 1962 four large classrooms, a front portico and new pews were added. A new furnace was installed, the basement dining room was paneled and carpeted and the kitchen enclosed in 1970.

An ice cream social has been a yearly summer event for 50 years.

The small but faithful congregation is still very active. They share a minister with the Eagle Creek Presbyterian Church located on Route 20 in Northwest Township.

West Bethesda Cemetery

The cemetery is located on the southwest corner of County Roads I and 12. It has an iron fence around the front section and the church is on the west side facing north on County Road I. Tombstones face east and west except the military monument near the front center this surrounded with metal military markers with American flags.

The earliest date found was in Row 3.10 for Ester Martin dated 6 November 1850. The last interment was in 2012 for Ruth McQuilkin, Row 2.18.

There are no known records of lot owners or burials.

The Superior Township Trustees are caretakers of the cemetery.

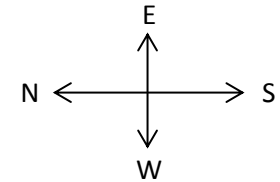
